deceased.) Original "Bill of Sale" obtained
by Curtis (2-12-80) was in possession
of Robert Pope, Dallas, Tx., who took his
own life in Feb. of 1987. Robert Pope
lost a fortune in the Texas oil Blumet....
and I had loaned Robert \$20,000 and
secured the Von Ribbentrop pistols as
loan collateral. All people, previous
owners, are known personally by me. I
swear under oath that the above infor-
mation is correct. These pistols have al-
ways been in possession of parties above,
never changed, nor modified in any respect.
